


A Letter from Pastor John



Friends of Grace, before we dive into our next programming year and beyond, I wanted to take a moment to reflect on our summer together, and more of what has gotten us this far and shaped our direction as we plan for the year to come.

Over the Summer, we have spent time looking at those things that are given a lot of weight in our culture, faith traditions, and more, even though they do not find their roots in scripture. Titled, "That's Not in the Bible!" our summer series has explored topics from what we wear to church, to who it is that God favors most. Some of my favorites were our Christmas in July service where we explored whether or not the wise men were there for the first Christmas celebration, and whether or not that is of the utmost importance, and also when we explored the role our buildings play at our outdoor worship service. It turns out, that while our sanctuary does not follow the pattern of the early church, it sure would have been nice to be inside during the rain.

My goal for the series was not to break down those parts of our faith that are helpful, even if they are not entirely based on scripture, but to help us know the difference. I hope that you found the topics engaging and are ready to jump into a new year of looking at exactly what the Bible does say, togther!

Once again, we will follow the Narrative Lectionary, which works through scripture in chronological order.

I find it helpful to work through the stories in order, seeing how the are interconnected, and I hope you do too.

Over the Summer we have also had a few wonderful things happening at Grace that are worth recognizing. Thank you to all who donated school supplies to the drive we held in the narthex. Those supplies have now been packed into backpacks and distributed to kids in our community who will use them to have a fresh start in these next few weeks.

Some of those kids were using the services of MY Place, an organization that provides after school and summer programming for young people in Mankato. They serve kids who are otherwise underserved, providing much needed structure and support for them. Because of your generosity, we also had the privilege to host their programs over the summer months at Grace, giving them a temporary place to serve our community through our building. Without your willingness to open the doors of our building this summer, many of these young people would have had nowhere else to go all summer. Thank you again.

Now we begin our Wednesday Night programming once more on September 13th, and I am excited to get back into the rhythm of the school year again. I hope you will join us for a meal, time to connect, and a more relaxed worship service each week starting at 5:15.

As we look ahead there is still much to do, finishing a strategic plan, growing our opportunities to serve our neighbors, and a sabbatical for me next year in the works. All good things, and so much to be excited about as we continue to grow together.

A Letter from Director of Spiritual Growth


It's hard to believe that the school year is fast approaching. I know as I write this some have already started back to school. I take this time and reflect on what a summer it has been. There have been so many great things that have happened throughout these last few months. Having MY Place in the building this summer has brought quite the energy around the building. So sit in my office and here the noise of young people making it's way through the staircase upstairs has been a real joy. Some may find the noise distracting but I find it fun to hear them. Then when I have something to do in the kitchen and they say hi it brightens me day. Some kids even have learned my name.

The summer kicked off with a great Vacation Bible School. We played games, did crafts, learned about how hunger is handled in different parts of the world and ate a lot of freeze pops. I love starting out the summer with VBS. It just seems to be a great way to start things off. While feeding the VBS kids lunch it was a great way to welcome the MY Place kids that started that week too as we got to have lunch together. Feeding the MY Place kids wasn't the only way we worked on feeding kids this summer.

For the second year in a row we assisted with the STOMP program through Feeding our Community Partners (FOCP). STOMP stands for Summer Time Outreach Meal Program and it provides meals everyday of the work week to kids in need of a meal. Volunteers from Grace delivered these meals every Monday throughout the summer to 3 locations in Mankato. These locations were carefully picked by FOCP as they are areas with many kids that don't have easy access to a nearby school to get a free lunch. This will be an ongoing program in the future and if this is something you want to possibly get involved with let me know. I'd love to get you on the schedule for next summer.

This summer along with delivering meals in partnership with FOCP we still got to be a location that fed people each week. Shelter Church concluded it's time here as a place of worship Sunday night but there was still a gap identified with food. Barb Heller and Penny Bandwart worked together alongside volunteers from other ELCA churches in town to provide dinner to those hungry in our community. It also provided a cool place to sit and relax on some of those warm summer days.

We have even gotten a chance to continue feeding people at the connections office all summer long as well. With the help from some of the older MY Place kids we were able to assemble 160 chicken and bean burritos that were frozen and have been taken to the freezer at connections.

As folks have stopped by the office for assistance the burritos have been an easy thing for them to grab heat up and go. I'm so excited that our feeding ministries continue to be strong at Grace and I'm excited to see them continue to grow in the future. As the summer continued to heat up, so did the things happening. At the end of July we had our Youth Boundary Waters trip. A few youth from Grace along with Liz Drake (a fantastic adult leader) went up the Gunflint trail and spent a few days in the Boundary Waters Canoe Area. We were able to invite along another group from St Pauls in Meridian and Zion in Ellendale to join us. We had a great time enjoying sunshine as we relaxed, ate some great food, jumped in the refreshing waters and enjoyed time in some of God's beautiful nature. I reflect back on that time in the BWCA with the group we took from Grace and I'm very thankful for those that went along. Next summer we'll be having our Adult Boundary Waters trip. More information about that trip will be released in the coming months. Next summer our big youth trip will be heading down to New Orleans for the National Youth Gathering, I'm excited for this trip as it's been almost 6 years since the last Youth Gathering.

We were able to gather together at ISG field this summer as part of Faith Night with the Mankato Moondogs. This was one of our Out with Grace events. 26 of us sat together and cheered on the Moondogs as we enjoyed hotdogs, chips and soda that was provided with our game ticket. We didn't get to see the Moondogs that night but it was a perfect evening for baseball and I know there were some great conversations in the stands. Our next Out with Grace event will be held September 8th at the Pleasant Grove Pizza Farm near Waseca. We hope you can join us for this event as it'll be a great way to kick on the school year.

As we get closer to the school year we know there are many kids in the community that struggle with getting the things they need for school each year. We had the opportunity and pleasure to partner with Schools for a pack to school drive through the month of July. Scheels had over 150 backpacks that they wanted to fill with school supplies.

Grace along with Messiah and the Pickle barn were drop off points to collect supplies. Our shopping cart was overflowing with supplies by the end. My wife Betsy thought they'd be able to lift the cart into the Scheels van. She was very wrong; it was way too heavy. The backpacks got filled and then got distributed to kids in need at MY Place and FOCP held a distribution event where all the backpacks were gone in less than an hour. What an amazing way to step up and care for our neighbors.

Our first week we'll have pizza together starting at 5:15. Education will once again follow the meal this year beginning at 6:00. We'll end the evening with worship at 6:45. This year we hope to add some great things to the evening to help support families where they're at and provide some more opportunities for all to make Wednesday Nights at Grace something everyone is excited to come and attend.

Council Recap

There have been many exciting things that the church council and members of Grace Lutheran have been working on this year, and I would like to take the opportunity to give everyone an update.

As a church we have continued to grow our community outreach and the food recovery program. These programs provide the church an opportunity to give back to the community and help support people in need in our area. The church has also received a grant to purchase a van and trailer that will further support this program and various other activities at Grace.

Over the summer we also welcomed My-Place into our church. My-Place is a local charity dedicated to providing a safe place for kids to learn and grow. My-Place was in immediate need of a location at the beginning of this summer or risk having to turn away many of the kids and families they work with. We as a church were able to accommodate My-Place and their activities so they were able to continue their service to the community.

Reconciling in Christ (RIC) is another initiative we have started working on at Grace. RIC is a program for faith communities to see, celebrate, and advocate for people of all sexual orientations, gender identities, and gender expressions in the Lutheran Church.

Last, the church council has recognized the need for focused short-term and long-term planning. Covid changed how people attended worship, participated in activities, and affected how the church operates on a daily basis. The church council has been working on establishing a plan for our church moving forward. This has involved getting feedback from the congregation, identifying our strengths and weaknesses, finding ways to support our congregation and staff, and focusing our efforts to grow and strengthen our ministries.

Grace continues to have generous support from our members and friends. Designated Giving are gifts that were given to a specific program at Grace, such as the Food Ministry, free will offerings for meals, radio broadcast, etc. A change was made in how we record these gifts and related expenses in 2023 making it hard to do a true comparison of giving in this area. Miscellaneous includes gratuities for use of the building, reimbursements from Redeemer and other small miscellaneous items. The increase in expenses is primarily due to increased costs in many of requires expenses.

Building Renovation Fund

Building Renovation Fund: As of Aug 1, 2023, we have paid off \$159,283 of our renovation loan: of that, \$137,020 was through contributions to the capital campaign. The remaining balance on the loan is \$229,917. We've reduced the final payment date by about 11 ½ years. The interest rate on the loan will be adjusted on May 31, 2024. I anticipate that our interest rate will increase at that time. If you have pledged to the capital campaign, please consider completing your pledge before that date.

New Church Management Software

Morgan and I are really excited to introduce you to the new software we are using. It's called Breeze, and allows us to keep track of all our members and friends, their contact information, important life and church events, and donations. We are able to send emails and texts to better communicate electronically. And most exciting, every member will have access to the contact information for other members through an app on your phone or tablet or the Breeze website. You will also be able to update any information in your own account, like a new address, cell phone or email address. Awesome!

We're still in the process of cleaning up some data that was transferred from our prior system, but when that is completed, all members will receive information on how to access the system. And we'll be able to print a directory with the contact information for all of our members. In the future, we plan to incorporate photos!

Thrivent Action Teams

Thrivent, a fraternal benefit organization, gives every member access to two \$250 grants each year to fund service or educational programs in their community. Grace has used two of these grants this summer.

In July, an Action Team grant was used to purchase 24 complete sets of school supplies for the backpacks provided by Scheels. When added to the generous donations made by the members and friends of Grace, we were able to provide a portion of the backpacks given to the kids at MYPlace.

In August, yarn for making prayer shawls was purchased through another Action Team grant. Our Knit and Chain group will be able to create 9 new prayer shawls because of this grant. All knitters and crocheters are invited to join us. Knit and Chain generally meets the first Monday of the month at 1pm in the Ramp Room. Next meeting will be Sept. 11 due to Labor Day.

In July, we attended a Mankato Community Band Concert. It was a beautiful summer evening, with great music and good company.


